## **OLD BUSINESS**

### **A. DISCUSSION OF: ARTS, CULTURE, AND HERITAGE 2016 – 2021 MASTER PLAN**

The Committee discussed the feedback provided by City Council. The Committee discussed the Master Plan:

- Art that is privately funded to be placed on private property is not the Committee's responsibility unless a request is made of the Committee by the property owner or City Council. A property owner may be required to adhere to other City ordinances or engineering regulations.
- The Committee supports the placement of publicly funded art on private property, which is publicly visible as long as all necessary agreements are in place. There is precedence for this – LaFontaine temporary sculpture, and Icarus on the Encore building. But, the Arts, Culture, and Heritage Committee is not actively looking to place publicly funded art on private property.
- The Committee will advocate for inclusion of art on private developments. The Committee is happy to partner with or serve in an advisory capacity for private entities looking to acquire art that will be publicly visible.

The Committee gave consensus to discuss the Master Plan at their November meeting.
